

A plain and a view towards the hill of Moncalieri
The area is divided into 2 parts:
A northern zone and a southern zone

54 farms in the area

#### **CURRENT AGRICULTURE**

-> very scattered fields

In the 2 zones:

Mainly sweet corn and wheat
Also vegetables and pasture in rotation, but no livestock
Most of the farmers have less than 5 hectares in the area

### MAIN ISSUES

Diversity
- culture, sport, recreation, agriculture, industry and other functions are located here

An unbalanced area
- 2 completely different parts

southern part

– agriculture, less people, isolation,
northern part

– leisure activities, less employment

Absence of a functional connection between the 2 parts

The Po river is a connecting element between the 2 parts and is important for both recreation and agriculture

Agriculture in the area is not viable
