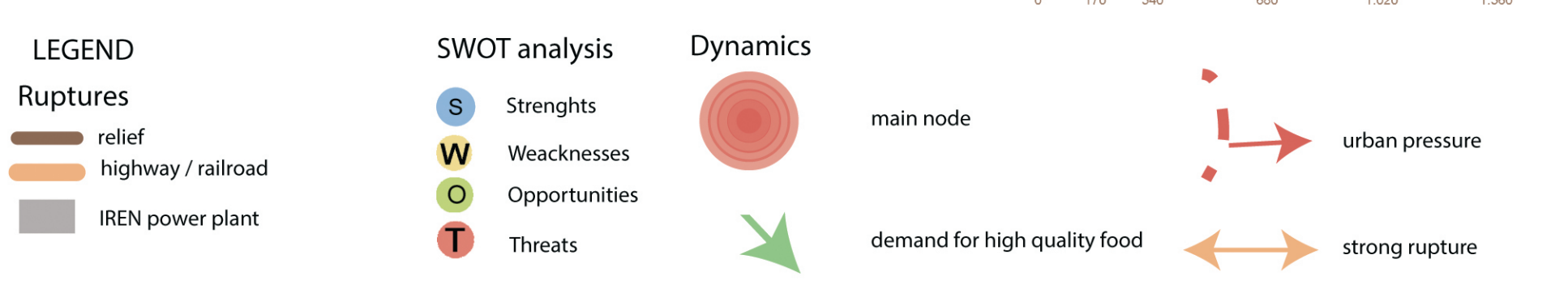
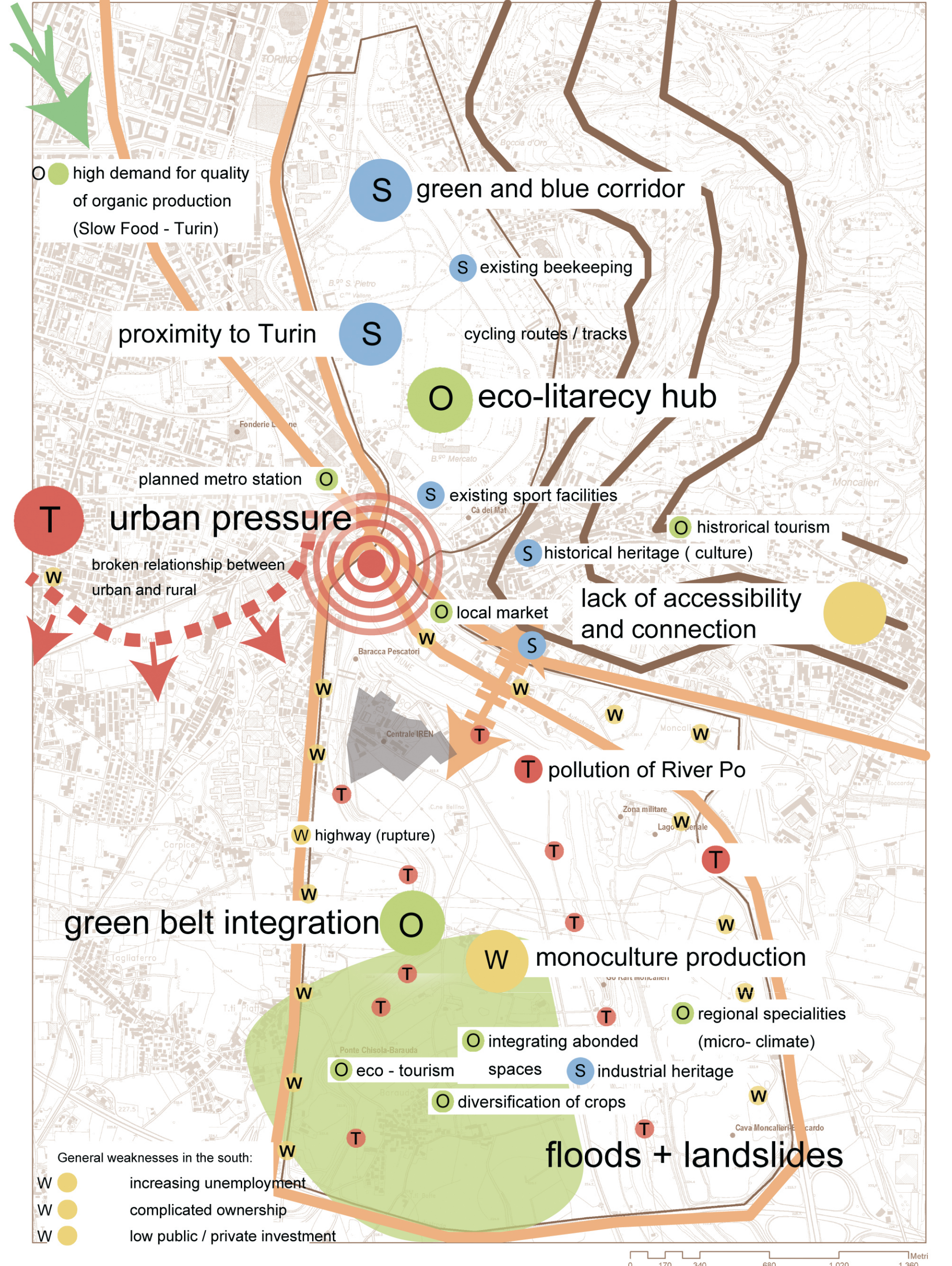
SYNTHESIS MAP



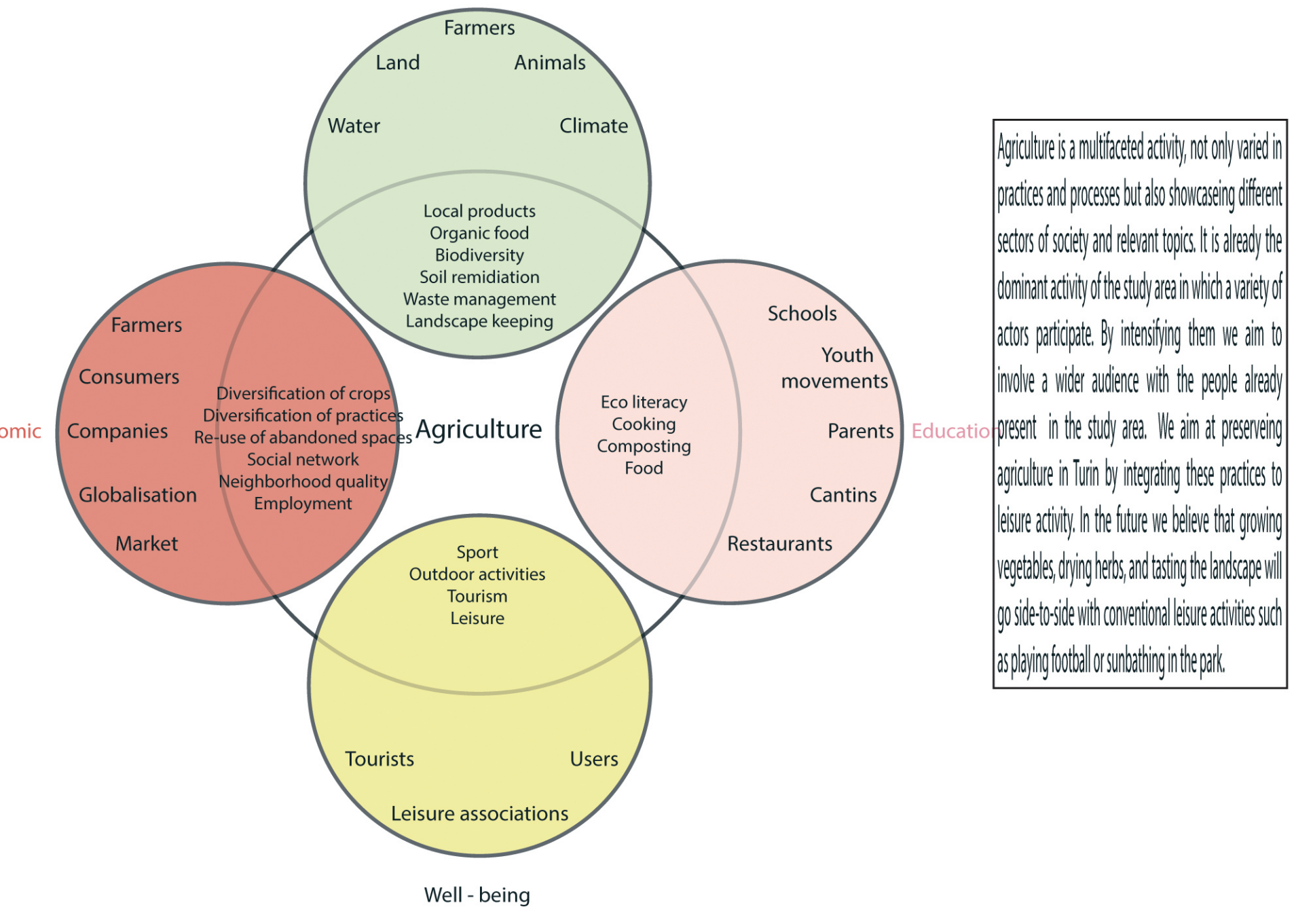
## SWOT analysis
