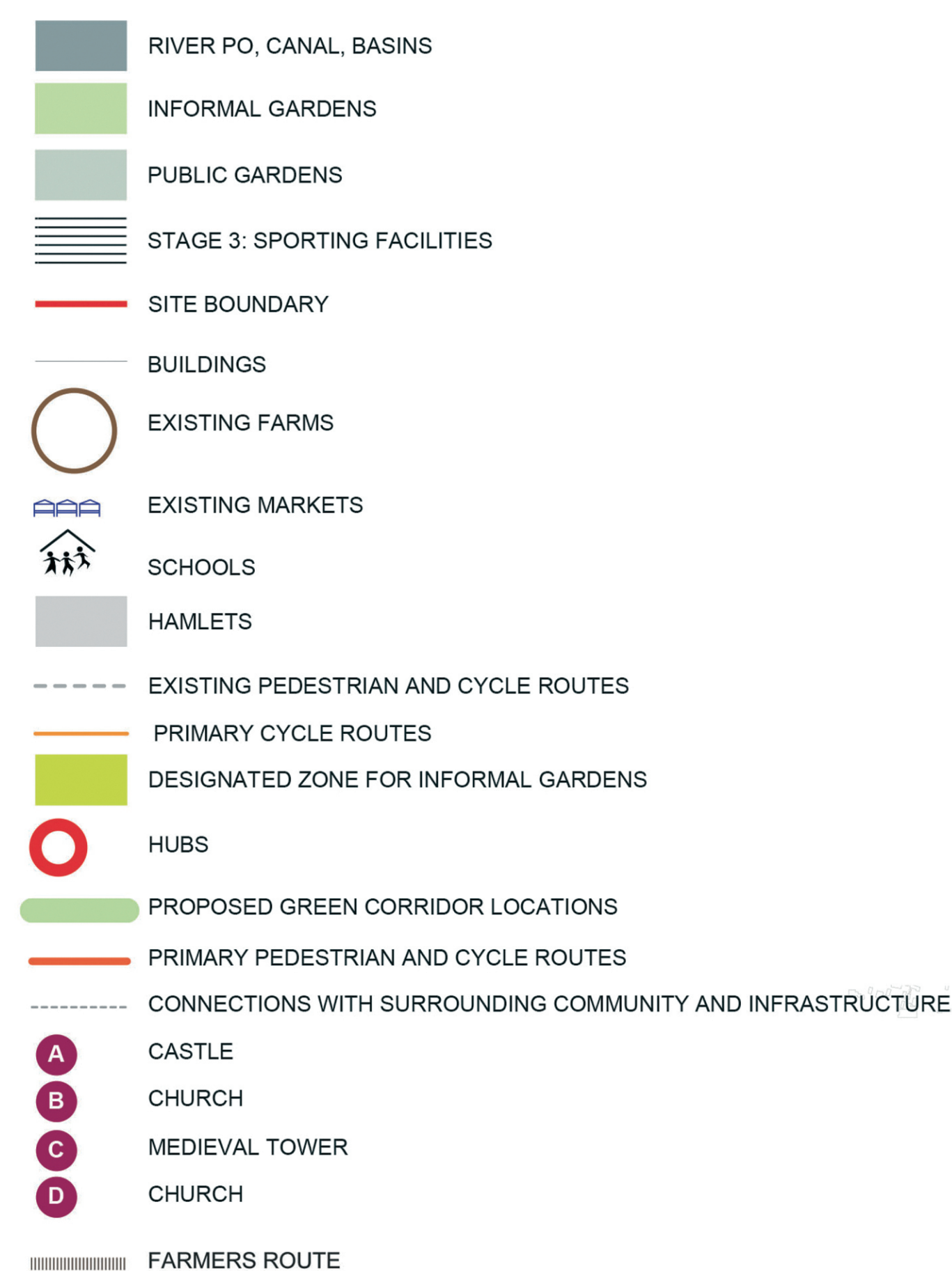

AGRI-HUBS: Uniting farmer, produce, community, education and tourism through a single infrastructural link and production centre(s) – centred on the idea of 'the agricultural experience'



To reconnect the fragmented post industrialist landscape and social disparity through a common infrastructural link, constructed from the identified connections between community, farming, view and existing activity.

The main protagonist in this concept = the farmer.

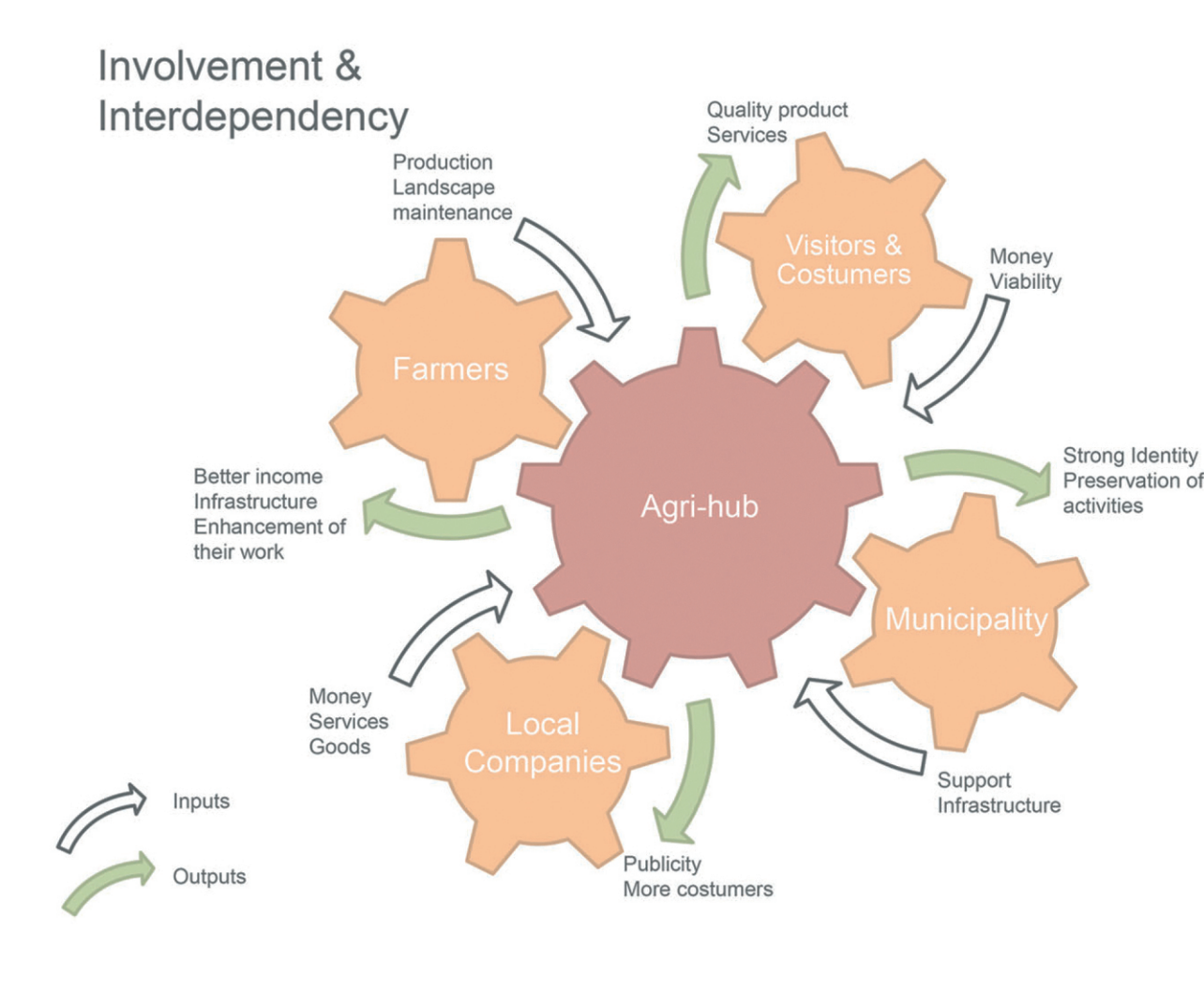
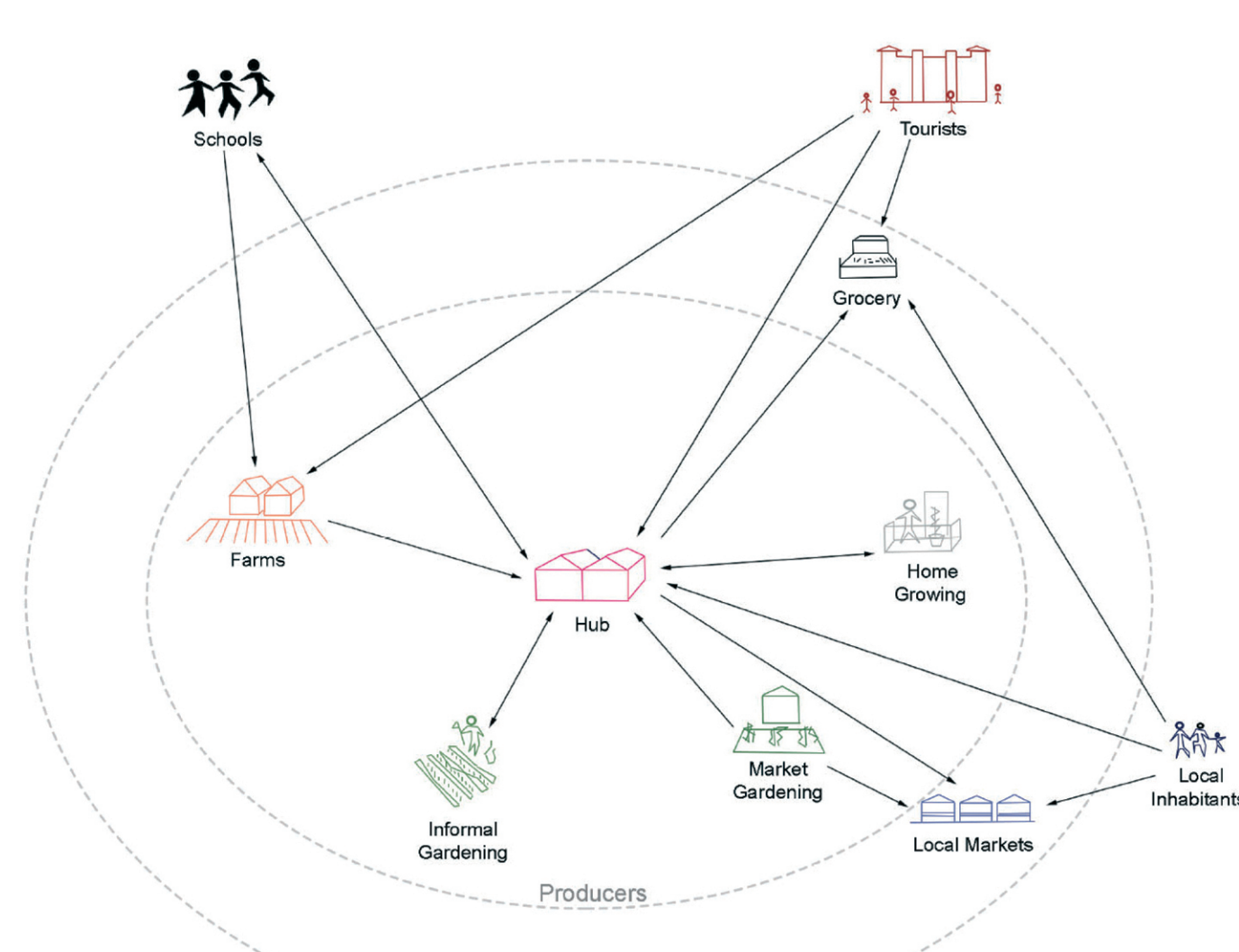
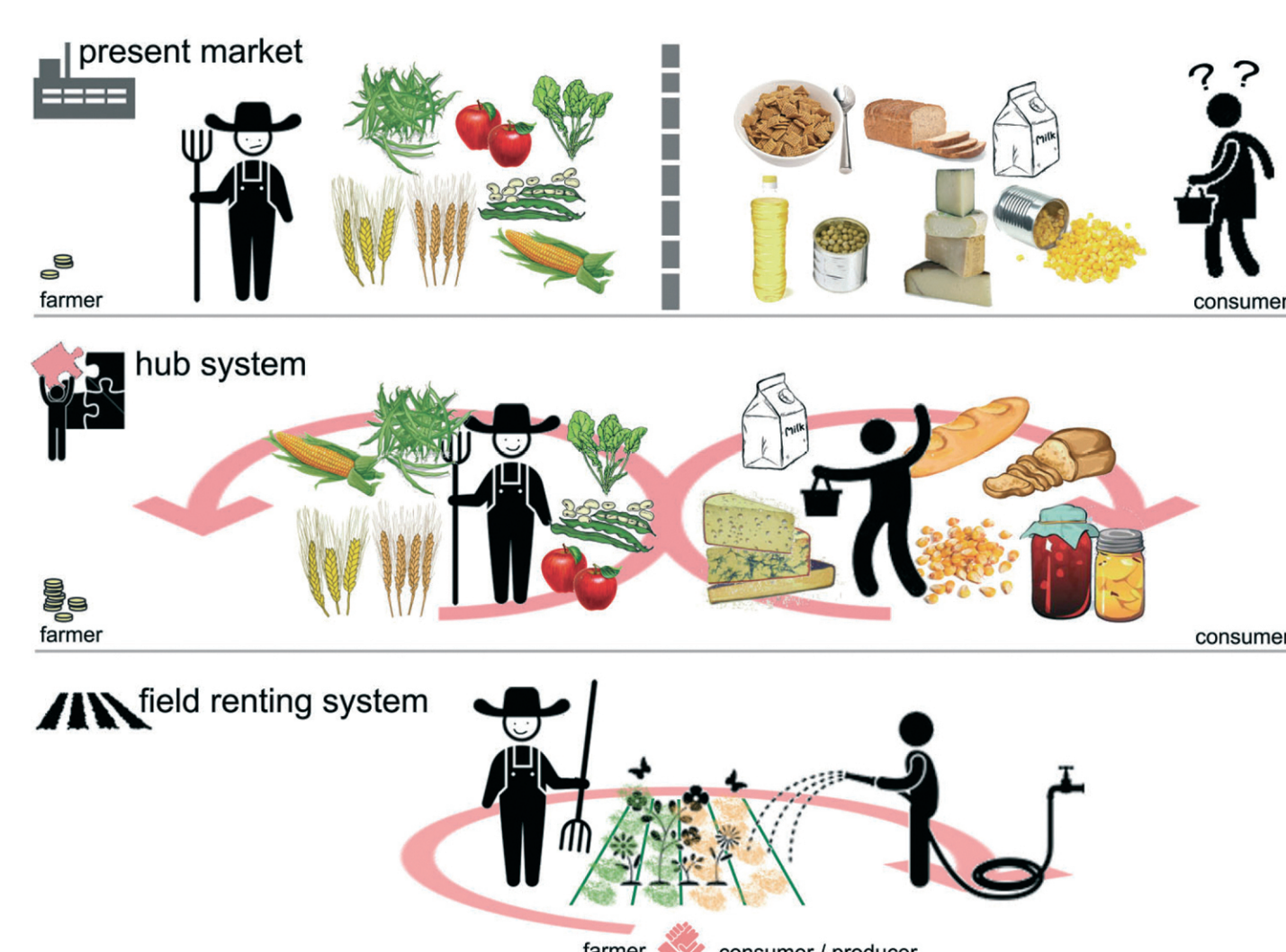
This habitable route will connect several new enterprises to a central core(s) – 'THE FOOD FACTORY'... the hub(s) where small enterprises (The small hold farmer, the allotment gardener or the general public). Can bring their goods and develop into a higher valued product... such as milk to cheese, grapes to wine/ jam. The two designated hubs will be located within the derelict industrialist buildings.

In addition, the public can visit such venues on levels of entertainment, social gathering, learning (such as cooking classes) and as a consumer... Consequently, increasing the problematic low income of such aforementioned enterprise. The farms, allotments and gardens will also be assessable along such routes..

Along this route there are other to be other community spaces to answer the other fluctuating demands of a concentrated inner city landscape... such as a space to relax, walk, cycle, play... etc.

The area: Our project will not only focus on the existing farming areas and post-industrialist buildings but will also expand the farming area onto areas of the site currently outlined as 'un-buildable landscapes', such as the contaminated post-industrialist land and areas prone to flooding... these areas will therefore demand a more sophisticated approach to Urban Agriculture in contrast to the existing methodologies. Such space has been set aside for the community gardener and educational experimentation.

The project has been designed to provide the framework for which a collaborative community may expand on through time and need..
